

# **FAQs**



## Can I give to multiple charities?

Yes, at least one designation is required and you can designate to up to five of the approved 2023 LA SCCC charities (see pages 5-8).



## When does my payroll donation start?

Your payroll deducted contribution made during the 2023 LA SCCC will begin January 2024 and continue through the last pay period in December 2024.



# Why isn't my preferred charity on the 2023 list?

Annually, all health and human service non-profit agencies, registered in good standing with the state, are eligible to apply to be a part of the LA SCCC. It is to the discretion of the charitable organizations as to whether they want to apply and some organizations may have applied and not met all of the requirements.



# How do charities use funds received from the LA SCCC?

Charities use all donations received from the LA SCCC to provide services and benefits to the citizens of Louisiana.
